***The New Era of Documentary Filmmaking  
in Georgia***

*(begins November 6, 2018)*

This seminar will be moderated by **Hal Jacobs**, a Decatur-based documentary filmmaker who also organizes a bimonthly screening of “short docs” that focuses on southern people and places. Jacobs will share excerpts from his own work that includes stories about segregation at the Fox Theater; efforts by Chattahoochee Riverkeeper to protect Atlanta’s waterways; biographies of two strikingly different women from the north Georgia mountains, Lillian Smith and Mary Hambidge. Guests will include interviewees from the films and other area filmmakers who focus on Georgia people and places.

The seminar will meet at the Fox Center from **7-8:30pm for four Tuesday evening** sessions during the 2018 fall semester: **November 6, 13, 20 and 27**. Everyone from the Atlanta community is welcome and invited to join us for this free seminar.
